DIY Table Setting Decors

Etched Bud Vase Centerpieces Simple, beautiful and striking

Information

Simple, beautiful, and striking. A single red bloom in a clear, etched bud vase or bottle will get your guest's attention and appreciation without being over-the-top or gaudy. Etch with letters spelling out words such as "love", "kiss", "unity", "promise", and "forever". Or, etch with monograms and hearts.

- Clear bud vases or bottles.
- Etching cream and brush
- Stencils
- Painter's tape

Rinse Rinse etching cream from glass surface.

Clean inside and outside of vase or bottle. Dry outside thoroughly.

Prepare Surface

Tape Stencil

Securely attach stencil to bottle using painter's tape

Brush etching cream evenly over stencil area. Allow to sit for length of time recommended by manufacturer.

Etch Stencil

Note: Only rinse cream off in a fiberglass or stainless steel sink to avoid etching of surface.

Lace and twine go together perfectly for country and rustic weddings. Rather than use napkin rings, wrap your silverware in paper lace doilies and tie with a pretty twine bow. Two materials and no instructions needed! Beautiful and simple.

Simple Recycled Bottle Flower Vases Save the earth

Looking for a cute, economical, and environmentally friendly way to decorate? Start saving various types of glass bottles. Empty, wash well, and remove the labels (and residual glue). Decorate and pop in a single bloom or two for simple beauty.

- Assorted glass bottles (clean with labels removed)
- Scrapbook paper
- Double-sided tape
- Scissors or paper cutter
- •Twine or ribbon



Measure glass jars for the area in the middle portion of the bottle. Measure around the bottle. Cut a strip of beautiful scrapbook paper in the length and width of your measurements.

Cut Scrapbook Paper

Attach Paper

Wrap paper around the center of the bottle, overlapping slightly. Secure both ends of paper to bottle/paper using double-sided tape so that it does not show.

Tie a simple piece of twine or thin ribbon snuggly around bottle in a small knot. Secure underneath with a tiny piece of doublesided tape if needed.

> Tie with Ribbon or **Twine**

Note: You can also add lace, ribbon, or rick rack trim to top and bottom of paper to make it extra pretty

Tissue Paper Pom-Poms Definitely not for sneezing

Information

Tissue paper pom-poms are simple to make and cute as can be! Large ones can be hung from ceilings or small ones can be hung from table centerpieces on simple wooden branches.

- •20" x 30" Tissue Paper Sheets (8 sheets per pom-pom)
- Scissors
- •Floral Wire (cloth covered, 24 gauge)
- •Ribbon
- •Spray Glitter (optional for a little sparkle)









Fold Tissue Accordion Style

Lay 8 sheets of tissue paper in a stack. Fold accordion style in approximately 1 ½" folds. Make sure to crease with each fold.

Wrap Floral Wire Around Folded Tissue

Cut a piece of floral wire in a length of approximately 18". Fold in half and then slip around tissue paper at middle and twist. Or, use a shorter piece of wire and loop a long ribbon underneath before twisting. This will be used to hang the pom pom.

Separate Tissue Layers Carefully

Separate individual tissue paper layers by pulling gently away and up from bunch. Continue working to form ball. Fluff and hang.

Prepare to Fold

Lay folded tissue so that both sides resemble a fan facing outwards in opposite directions.

Trim Tissue Paper Ends

Using scissors, trim both ends of tissue stack in either a rounded or pointy shape depending on preference.

Candy Bar Sucker Topiary Centerpieces

Everyone loves a sweet candy or dessert bar at a wedding. It brings out the kid in everyone! Create adorable lollipop centerpieces very simply using "dum-dum" suckers, a foam ball, and cute but inexpensive vase/pot.

- •Jumbo Bags of Dum-Dum suckers (quantity depends on ball size and number of topiaries to be made)
- •Styrofoam ball/s
- •Flowerpot Style Vase







Ball should be large enough to sit easily but securely on top of flowerpot with some overlap on the rim. It should look similar to an ice cream cone shape.

> **Position Styrofoam Ball** in Flowerpot

Poke Dum-Dum Suckers In Ball

Beginning at the top of the ball, and working in a circular pattern going down, poke suckers into ball. Space so that each sucker is touching each other and little Styrofoam is showing through. Continue until ball is completely covered.

Finding the perfectly aged flower containers for rustic, country weddings can be a challenge. Do it yourself easily - no instructions required - by putting diluted bleach in a spray bottle and squirting shiny new galvanized buckets. Be sure to do this in an area where bleach will not harm surface, or be a hazard to plants, pets, or people. Leave in sun to dry and evaporate. Choose coordinating wedding flowers or wildflowers for a charming centerpiece.

- •Pens
- Craft Tags
- Paint Pens
- Cardstock
- •Hole Punch
- •Twine or Ribbon

According to seating chart, use paint pen to prepare craft tags with table numbers for each guest. Attach to pen



Fold several sheets of cardstock in half (top to bottom), creasing well. Use different coordinating color for cover. Hole-punch two holes along crease and feed twine or ribbon through holes, tying in a pretty bow



Decorate Cover

Write "Leave a message for (insert bride & groom's name) to read on their (table number) year wedding anniversary." Place on table for reception.

- •Thick patterned paper (cardstock, scrapbook etc)
- •Double-sided tape (or staples)
- Sheer fabric
- •Ribbon
- Tags
- Candy



Use <u>template</u> to create cone shape. Wrap patterned paper into cone shape. Seal edges using double-sided tape (or staples).

Make Cone

Cut sheer fabric and place candies on top. Gather into a ball shape and tie at top with ribbon.

Heart and cherry shapes are cute ideas for tags. Be sure to add a special "thank you" note. Attach tag to cone.

String Chandelier/Lantern

Bubbles made of lace

Information

Like lace bubbles floating on air, these string balls can be hung to form a chandelier. You can also add lights to make them light up a wooded ceremony or reception venue. They're a bit messy to make, but a fun project with a group of bridal attendants helping. This project is best done outdoors or in an easy clean-up area like a garage or basement.



Prepare the Following Supplies

- Latex balloons or "punching balloons"
- Vaseline
- Glue (white school type)
- Cornstarch
- Warm Water
- Twine or varn
- Scissors
- Quick dry spray paint (or use colored yarn)
- Spray glitter (if desired)
- Fishing line
- Tarp or shower curtain
- Bowls for glue mixtures (if using a lot of yarn, use big bowls)
- Rack, or pole (such as dowel rod) for hanging/drying wet balloons

Step 1: Set-up Work Area: Spread tarp or shower curtain on work area floor. Make sure you have some type of rack available to hang balloons while they dry. This should be placed over tarp to catch drips. You can create a rack by placing a dowel rod over kitchen chairs.

Step 2: Make Paste: Combine ½ cup glue, ½ cup corn starch, and ¼ cup warm water and mix well in bowl. Mix to be sure there are no lumps and clumps. Adjust quantities as needed to get correct consistency. Quantity needed will depend on how many chandeliers you plan to make.

Step 3: Prepare Balloons: Blow up balloons and rub outside with petroleum jelly. This will help prevent the string from adhering to the balloon when dry. When finished, wash hands to remove oil. COPYRIGHT © 2014. THE WEDDING BLOG NETWORK | 24

Procedure II

Step 4: Working with Yarn: Do not cut yarn in pieces. Work with one long strand. Tie yarn to balloon knot before beginning work.

- Place yarn in bowls (as much as will fit that you need).
- Allow yarn to soak up glue mixture. Squeeze out excess using fingers. Avoid tangling yarn.
- Begin wrapping yarn around balloon surface.
 Wrap a few times vertically and then a few times horizontally and diagonally. Keep wrapping string around making sure not to overlap any more than needed. Think of how it will look once the balloon is removed.
- Continue wrapping vertically and horizontally until you have the coverage you want. Tie (or tuck) the end of the yarn under at the top of the balloon by the knot before cutting.




Step 5: Hang to Dry: Tie a dry piece of yarn to the balloon knot. Tie to drying rack pole. Allow to dry thoroughly – minimum of 24 hours. Rushing this process will result in failure.

Step 6: Remove Balloon: Once dry, pop the balloon. Do this carefully to avoid collapsing the string chandelier. Pull balloon through holes gently. Cutting balloon into smaller pieces with scissors may make this easier.

Step 7: Spray Paint & Glitter Spray: If you didn't use colored yarn and want to add color (silver etc), gently spray paint the dry chandelier. Do not over spray! Allow to dry. If you want extra sparkle, lightly spray with spray glitter.

Rustic Ribbon Chairback Decorations

Chair covers no more



Looking for a simple and romantic alternative to traditional chair covers? Do it simply and beautifully using assorted ribbons tied in knots and allowed to dangle gracefully down the back of the chair. So simple to do, yet so charming.

- Assortment of Ribbons (monotone or complimenting the wedding colors)
- Measuring Tape
- Scissors



Measure Base Length

Measure from the top rung of the chair to the point below the seat where you want the ribbon to hang. Add enough extra length for the ribbon to loop over the top rung and be knotted.

Cut Ribbon

Cut ribbon in desired lengths according to the measurements taken. You can cut them all the same base length, or use varying lengths if you prefer.

Loop and Knot

Loop ribbon over top rung of chair and tie a knot. Allow ribbon to hang down the back of the chair.

Notch Ribbons

Notch ends of ribbon in a "V" shape to give a finished look.

Winter Wonderland Iced Branches

Walking in a winter wonderland

Imagine your guests arriving at your wedding to be led down an aisle of glistening, iced branches. You can create this delicate effect easily on your own.

- •Tree branches (without leaves)
- Tacky Craft Glue
- Newspapers
- Colorfill Diamond Vase Filler
- •Glitter (if desired for extra sparkle)
- •Spray Paint (if white, silver, or other color branches are desired)



If you don't
want your
branches the
natural color,
spray paint first
and allow to
dry.

Spread newspaper on sturdy surface and lay branches out. Pour a medium sized pile of diamond filler and glitter on newspaper.

Rub branches smoothly and completely with tacky glue. Be sure not to leave drips or clumps. Lifting the newspaper, roll the branches in the glitter and diamond filler to coat evenly.

Repeat on other side.

Allow to dry.

Note: You can also add special additions such as holly berries, moss, and lights to make the branches extra festive. This technique also works on other decorations such as pine cones etc.

Baby's Breath Bouquet

There's something ethereal and angelic about baby's breath. It's so delicate and pure that it's perfect for a wedding even when used alone in a bouquet. It's also economical (less than \$100 for 100 stems), easy to find, and easy to work with. Bouquets can be made the day before the wedding and stored in a cool place until the special moment. If you're nervous about your abilities, buy some flowers ahead of time and make a trial bouquet to build your confidence. Make sure to determine the quantity of stems you need overall before ordering or purchasing. While simple baby's breath is beautiful, you can also add greenery without adding a lot of cost.

- Baby's Breath (Gypsophila)
- •Ribbon
- •Florist Pins (or Hot Glue Gun)
- Scissors



Determine Size

Determine how many stems of baby's breath you will need for each bouquet. The bride's and maid of honor's bouquets are usually larger and more elaborate than the other bridal attendants.

Gather Flowers

Gather desired number of stems together in a bunch. Have someone hold the bunch while

Wrap with Ribbon

Starting just below the baby's breath blooms start wrapping the ribbon tightly down the length of the stems, slightly overlapping as you go. Continue wrapping until you are about halfway down the stems.

Secure Ribbon

Secure ribbon wrap either with florist pins or hot glue. If using florist pins, make sure to insert them on a fairly sharp diagonal so they enter the stems rather than sticking out the other side.

Trim Stems

Trim the stems so that the bridal bouquet is approximately 10" long from the blooms down.

Add Additional Ribbon Bow if Desired

Ring Bearer Signs

"Ooh's" and "aah's" always come with the entrance of the ring bearer and flower girl. But, sometimes the formality of the job can be overwhelming for a young child. Make it a fun job (and adorable sight!) by having him carry a cute announcement sign. Or, if the ring bearer is especially young, have him take a relaxing ride in an antique wagon (with sign) to make it fun and avoid stage fright.

- •Rustic (but sanded for safety) Wood
- Stencils
- Paint
- •1" x 2" lumber for post (if carried)
- •Hammer and Nails (if carried with post)
- •Twine or Rope for sign (if held)
- Drill (to make holes for rope/twine)

Starfish Wedding Program Duo

Wish upon a program star


Cool off your beach weddings guests with an adorable seashell program/fan combination. If creating a double-sided fan, you may want to do calligraphy on wedding party information side, and use printer for program (or verse/poem) on reverse. Or, print both sides on separate cardstock and attach back-to-back with popsicle stick in the middle. Simple...no complicated instructions required!

- •Starfish <u>Template</u> and/or Stencil (edit to size)
- Cardstock in Blues, Sand, and Pale Yellow
- Wooden Stick (such as popsicle stick)
- Hot Glue Gun

Confetti Chandelier

Information

Very inexpensive and beautiful confetti chandeliers can be created using simple materials you may already have around your home. These delicate chandeliers can be hung above the cake table, gift table, or anywhere you want a delicate and romantic touch.

- •Colored Cardstock (ideally in monotone colors or 4-5 coordinating colors)
- Large Size Hole Punch (or scissors)
- String
- •Needle
- •Hot Glue Gun
- Embroidery Hoop
- Paint (if hoop will be painted)

Step 1: Paint Embroidery Hoop (if desired):

Paint to match or coordinate with confetti and/or wedding theme colors. Allow to dry fully before attaching string.

Step 2: Punch or Cut 1" Circles of Cardstock: Make sure you punch or cut plenty for the number and length of strands you want on each chandelier. Approximately 120 or more per chandelier is a good place to start and adjust as needed.

Step 3: Use a Threaded Needle to Thread Confetti on String: Leave 2-3" of string for attaching strand to hoop. Begin at top of thread and thread through center of each paper confetti circle. At the bottom of each confetti piece, dab a dot of hot glue to hold the piece in place. Continue working and threading down the length of the string. Continue until you have enough strands to form the chandelier with the fullness you desire.



Step 4: Criss-Cross and Attach 4-6 Strings Across the Top of Embroidery Hoop: These strings allow you to tie strands in the center of the hoop giving a 3D effect. It also provides you with a base from which to hang the hoop from the ceiling.

Step 5: Tie Strands to Hoop and Criss-Crossed Center Strings One at a Time:

Carefully tie the strands to the hoop and center strands using care not to tangle the strands. Adjust the lengths of the strands as needed for visual interest. Attach embellishments such as silk or dried flowers to the hoop to match the theme for extra beauty.

Tin Can Lantern Rustic Lighting

Information

For a rustic wedding, tin can lanterns cast a beautiful glow along the aisle or entry way. They can also be used as part of the centerpieces combined with flowers and greenery. They are simple to make and a great way to recycle items you already have at home.

- •Aluminum Cans in Desired Size/s (coffee cans, baby formula cans, canned vegetable cans etc)
- •Spray Paint for Metal Surfaces
- •Small Block of Wood to Fit Inside Can While Punching
- •lce Pick
- Tea Light Candles



Make sure that cans are clean, dry, and all labels and glue have been removed.

Use color choices such as white, metallic, or coordinating wedding colors. Work from top to bottom and spray in short bursts to avoid drips and runs. Allow to dry completely.

Fither freehand your design, or transfer a design to the can using pencil or chalk. Place small wooden block inside can to prevent denting the can while punching. Use icepick to carefully punch holes in design outline.

The day of your event, arrange lanterns and place small candle or tea light inside the can. Light and watch the warm glow spread through your venue.

Romantic Honeymoon Car Flower Garland

Information

An old-fashioned floral and greenery garland attached to your honeymoon departure vehicle is as romantic as can be. You can make your own greenery garland or purchase one already made and just add the flowers. Prepared greenery will stay fresh for 5-7 days when properly stored. Floral accents can be added the day before to stay fresh.

- •Premade/cut greenery garland (length depending on vehicle/preferences)
- Scissors
- Enclosed Cone Floral Oasis (2)
- •Water and Bowl
- Flowers
- Ribbon (if desired)
- •Floral Wire



Soak floral oasis in bowl of water for 10-20 minutes to ensure it's thoroughly wet

Soak Oasis

Secure floral oasis cone to greenery garland wire securely.

Insert additional greenery stems or smaller long-stemmed flowers in the base portion of the oasis.

> **Insert Smaller Blooms**

Insert Larger Blooms

... in the top portion of the oasis

Procedure II



Continue adding flowers until entire oasis is covered.

> **Continue Adding Flower**

Repeat process on opposite side of garland.

If you'd like to add ribbons, attach to greenery wire and allow to stream down vehicle.

> **Add Ribbons if Desired**

Attach to Vehicle

Tie ribbon or twine to oasis/garland wire. Run end of ribbon or twine under open trunk and secure underneath. Repeat on both sides.

Cinnamon Stick Garland



For a fall or winter wedding, the smell of cinnamon is the perfect aroma. Create a rustic and sweet cinnamon stick garland to drape in front of your cake or dessert table...or anywhere you want a little spice!

- Cinnamon Sticks
- Twine
- Scissors



Cut twine in desired length of your garland. Remember to allow for extra length to account for knotting.

Beginning at one end of the twine, place cinnamon stick on twine and tie knot around the stick. Continue down the length of twine adding sticks and tying knots until you have the length desired.

If your guests must travel a decent distance from the parking area to the ceremony location, consider placing wedding vow walkway signs along the way. Beginning with, "We are gathered today..." and continuing to "I now pronounce you..." It's a great way to get everyone excited for the ceremony to come. And, be sure to paint these individual words on the opposite side to read as they leave... "and — they — will — live — happily — ever — after — from — this — day - forward". Fill in as needed with hearts and "XXXX OOO" if needed.

- •Small sheets of wood or plywood
- •1" x 4" lumber for signposts
- •Hammer and nails or wood glue
- White paint

Chalkboard Picture Frame Signs

 Chalkboard signs have endless uses in weddings. From directional signs, to quotes about love, and even menus, chalkboards are romantic and easy to use. If you make a mistake, just erase and begin again. Plus, they can be used later at home for office or kitchen notes.

- Thrift Store Picture Frame
- Chalkboard Spray Paint
- Spray Paint for Frame (if needed)
- Painter's Tape (only needed if glass cannot be removed)



Remove glass and picture (if any) from frame. Spray paint frame in desired color.

Prepare Frame

Prepare Glass

Clean glass well using window cleaner, vinegar, or alcohol. Dry. Spray paint glass using chalkboard paint. Allow to dry.

Place glass in frame and secure. Use chalk to create personalized signs for your guests.



- •Stiff Decorative Paper (like scrapbook paper) Cut in 7" Squares
- Scissors (if not pre-cut to size)



Fold 7" square of paper vertically and horizontally to make quarters.

Unfold and place decorative side face down.

Take each corner and fold it into the center of the square (point should touch center). Final result should make another square shape

Flip the square over and fold corners into center again.

Turn over again and place thumbs and forefingers in flaps (folding in half makes it easier) and lift.

Flip over on points and candy can be filled into cups.

Either print kraft label with design, monogram, logo, or message, or handwrite. Cut label to size (approximately 6" x 2" once cut, approximately 5 labels can be made for each 8 1/2" x 11" label sheet).

Assemble according to product directions. Set lids aside.

Carefully attach labels to pushpop. Make sure label is situated low enough to allow lid to be put on with no interference.

Confetti can be purchased in bags or cut from tissue paper with scissors. Stuff confetti inside push-pop holder. Place lid on push-pop and set in holder.

With coordinating tulle ribbon, create a dainty bow and slip over hanger hook.
